The rest of the meeting was devoted to discussing the common reading "Reframing Academic Advising for Student Success: From Advisor to Cultural Navigator" by Terrell L. Strayhorn, The Ohio State University. This was adapted for print from the NACADA Annual Conference Keynote presented in Minneapolis, MN on October 9, 2014. Our discussion centered on how students have to navigate a very different culture than what they have experienced previously when they enter college. Although students of various ethnic and racial backgrounds have access to college, access without success does not benefit students. As faculty and staff at Stockton, it is our job to make sure students feel as though they belong and "matter" to the institution. This is not always easy, as there are barriers in the way. What can we do to become cultural navigators at Stockton, where our jargon, policies, and procedures may be difficult for students to understand? We are challenged to break down these barriers and assist students as they navigate the university.
