Teacher Candidate Basic Skills Requirement

Regulations adopted by the Board of Education June 4, 2014 include basic skills requirement for teacher preparation program entry and teacher certification As of September 1, 2015:

- x Candidates starting a Certificate of Eligibility with Advanced Standin EAS educator preparation program (formerly known as "traditional route") mustneet the basic skills requirement prior to starting courseworkin a program
- x Candidatesseeking an initial Certificate of Eligibility (CE) (formerly known as "alternate route") must meet the basic skills equirement prior to being issue a CE except:
 - o Candidates applying for CE with a career and technical educat(67TE) endorsement other than businesselated or family and consumer science endorsements ave until the application for astandard certificate to meet the basic skills requirement.

Two Ways to Meet the BsicSkills Requirement

1. Pass a Commission approved assessment of basic skills. Current tye only approved assessmentis the Praxis Core Academic Skillith passing scoress follows Reading: 156,
