 - a) The total enrollment during the Spring 2020 semester was 9,367. Of those students, Stockton University estimates that at least 85% of the students meet the Secretary's prescribed student eligibility criteria and are therefore eligible to receive these grants, assuming they incurred expenses related to the disruption in campus operations due to the coronavirus.
